PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) had declared COVID-19 (Coronavirus) to be a global pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States has declared an infectious disease national emergency to combat COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 15, 2020, the Governor of the State of Oklahoma has declared an emergency caused by the impending threat of COVID-19 to the people of this State and the public's peace, health and safety; and,

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, the Pittsburg County Commissioners have declared an emergency from the potential effects of COVID-9; and,

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has issued guidance for mass gatherings, community events, and public facilities; and,

WHEREAS, it is advised that communities limit public gatherings to crowds; and

WHEREAS, at the time of this proclamation, there have been 164 confirmed cases of COVID-19 within the State of Oklahoma and 0 cases in Pittsburg County; and

WHEREAS, mitigation actions will help prevent the spread of the infection and protect the health and safety of the City,

NOW, THEREFORE I, Bobby Watkins, Mayor of the City of Krebs, Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim and declare, as follows:

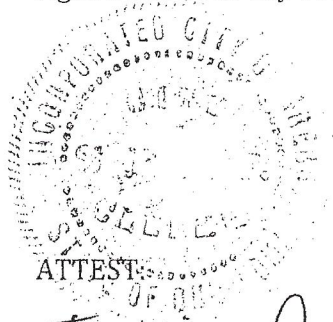
- I. A state of emergency exists within the city limits of Krebs, Pittsburg County, Oklahoma.
- II. This proclamation shall become effective at 12:01 a.m. March 26, 2020.
- III. The public facilities of the City of Krebs are closed to the public until April 2, 2020 or otherwise extended by the mayor.
- IV. Restaurants, bars, businesses, and privately-owned gathering places are highly recommended to ensure at least six (6) feet of space for each patron, per CDC recommendations.
- V. All businesses within the City of Krebs are highly recommended to ensure at least six (6) feet of space for each patron and only 10 people within the business at a time.
- VI. As per recommendation from Governor of the State of Oklahoma, businesses will be open for drive-thru, carry-out, and delivery services only.
- VII. All bars, breweries, and other establishments that sell liquor or beer by the drink are closed.
- VIII. All gyms, fitness centers, recreation centers, and other similar facilities will be closed.

- IX. This proclamation does not prohibit an employee, contractor, vendor, or supplier of a place of public accommodation from entering, existing, using, or occupying that place of public accommodation in their professional capacity.
- X. The restrictions imposed by this order do not apply to any of the following:
- a. Places for public accommodation that offer food and beverage not for on-premises consumption, including grocery stores, markets, convenience stores, dispensary, and food pantries, other than those portions of the place of public accommodation subject to the requirements of the section;
 - b. Crisis shelters or similar institutions.
- XI. For purposes of this order, "place of public accommodation" means a business, or an educational, refreshment, entertainment, or recreation facility, or an institution of any kind, whether licensed or not, whose goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages, or accommodations are extended, offered, sold, or otherwise made available to the public.
- XII. This order does not alter any of the obligations under the law of an employer affected by this order to its employees or the employees of another employer.

This order shall take effect on March 26, 2020 at 12:01 a.m. and shall terminate on April 9, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. unless otherwise acted on by Krebs City Council.
