PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization (WHO) had declared COVID-19 (Coronavirus) to be a global pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States has declared an infectious disease national emergency to combat COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Oklahoma has declared an emergency caused by the impending threat of COVID-19 for all of Oklahoma; and,

WHEREAS, the Pittsburg County Commissioners have declared an emergency from the potential effects of COVID-9; and,

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has issued guidance for mass gatherings, community events, and public facilities; and,

WHEREAS, it is advised that communities limit public gatherings to crowds; and

WHEREAS, at the time of this proclamation, there have been 53 confirmed cases of COVID-19 within the State of Oklahoma and 0 cases in Pittsburg County; and

WHEREAS, mitigation actions will help prevent the spread of the infection and protect the health and safety of the City,

NOW, THEREFORE I, Bobby Watkins, Mayor of the City of Krebs, Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim and declare:

- I. A state of emergency exists within the city limits of Krebs, Pittsburg County, Oklahoma.
- II. This proclamation shall become effective at 3:30 pm March 21, 2020.
- III. The public facilities of the City of Krebs are closed to the public until April 2, 2020.
- IV. Local restaurants, bars, businesses, and privately-owned gathering places are highly recommended to ensure at least six (6) feet of space for each patron, per CDC recommendations.
- V. All businesses with the City of Krebs are highly recommended to ensure at least six (6) feet of space for each patron and only 10 people within the business at a time.
- VI. Effective 12:01 a.m. March 23, 2020 until 12:01 a.m. March 25, 2020, business will be open for drive-thru, takeout, and delivery services only.

- VII. All bars, breweries, and other establishments that sell liquor or beer by the drink are closed.
- VIII. All gyms, fitness centers, recreation centers, and other similar facilities will be closed.
